PGY3 = two 2-week rotations (4 weeks total) *possibility of 3 2-week rotations (12 days total) with Derm rotation*

PGY3 Block #1 – 2 weeks (4 days):

Progress Meeting: Meet with the Community Liaison (CL) on the first day of CHPT block time to discuss project

Community Meetings: Resident will schedule as needed

Community Liaison Expectations: Support project implementation and evaluation as needed

Resident Expectations:

- Complete assigned reading materials (chp. 3 in *Resident Project Workbook*) before block time – workbook activities will be completed during your block time
- Begin implementing and evaluating project (if not already started)
- Begin completing workbook pages/activities pgs. 40-48 (activities will not be due until completion of PGY3 Block #2)
- Initiate/modify sustainability plan as needed
- Provide follow-up communication with Community Faculty/Partners and CL on progress
- **Make sure to communicate project details (day, time, location) with CL!**

Rotation Work Products:

- Activities on pgs. 40-48 including: *Outcome Data Analysis; Project Report (including questions on pgs. 46 & 47); Reflections (items are due when project completed or following completion of PGY3 Block #2 time)*

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PGY3 Block #2 – 2 weeks (4 days):

Progress Meeting: Meet with the Community Liaison (CL) on the first day of CHPT block time (PFCP rotation=Wednesday; PCM rotation=Thursday) to discuss project

Community Meetings: Resident will schedule as needed

Community Faculty Expectations: Support project implementation and evaluation as needed

Resident Expectations:

- Complete any unfinished workbook activities/pages in *Resident Project Workbook*
- Follow-up on sustainability plan and transition any pending items as needed
- Provide follow-up communication with Community Faculty and CL on progress
